

The Mouth of the Moniteau



The Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tunnel in Rocheport

Tucked about halfway between the City of Columbia and historic Boonville, Rocheport stands much as it has since the mid-19th century. The village was often referred to as The Mouth of the Moniteau. Remnants of times past can be found throughout the town's national historic district. There are stories of Native-Americans and the Great Spirit and of the exploration of the Louisiana Territory. River boats navigated the

Missouri, and a grand Whig convention was held. Bloody Bill's vicious Confederate outlaws seized the town, and scandalous goings-on surrounded the construction of the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Tunnel in Rocheport. Citizens enjoyed merry "moonlight excursions" on the river, and spectators watched as locomotives roared on the MKT line. Read about more history at www.RocheportMissouri.com.
